In mid-September, Hunter got the go-ahead to resume all activities!! We assume that his heartworm ordeal is over, and will know for sure in March which is the earliest he can be tested for the heartworm antigens.

Even better, he has Waldo the Whale back!! We hear him squeaking all over the house, and it brings a lightness back to a place that was a little gloomy over the summer.

He will have more tips for you in the following months. In the interim, please make sure that, especially in the warmer months, your dog is on a good heartworm preventative. With climate change the mosquitoes carrying the heartworm larvae are increasing, and the incidence is higher.

Hunter was almost for sure infected when he became part of our family. He is so much more active and happy now that he has been treated and presumably the heartworms are dead and gone!

Whitey—Whitey is a grey and white short haired female. Born on July 11th, she is playful and loving.






Bill—Bill is a sweet, playful and loving 12 weeks old male. He is black and white, and is short-haired.
