Christmastime Treats that are Dangerous for Pets

At Christmastime we want to share the joy of the season with our pets. There are special treats everywhere!! However, many treats that you might think to share should never be given to your furred friends.



- 1. Chocolate. Any kind of chocolate can be highly poisonous to both dogs and cats. Even chocolate drinks can be dangerous. Store your chocolate up high so that you can save all of that chocolatey goodness for yourself!
- 2. Cooked bones. Avoid giving cooked bones to your dog because they can stick, splinter and lodge in the throat. Raw bones are dangerous because they may cause salmonella.
- 3. Alcohol. Alcohol can cause many serious problems although you're unlikely to share a glass of wine with your dog or cat, make sure that the glass

isn't in a place for them to find!

- 4. Nuts. Aside from being a choking hazard, some nuts (in particular macadamia) can be very toxic to pets.
- 5. Onions, garlic and chives. These won't just give your pet bad breath, they are known to cause stomach and red blood cell damage!
- 6. Xylitol. Xylitol is a sweetener often used in place of sugar. It can also be found in some tooth-pastes or mouthwashes and even some peanut butter. It is incredibly toxic to animals.

Buy your furred friend a squeaky toy and forget trying to determine if people foods are toxic!
