## The Holidays and Your Pets

It's natural to want to include your pets in the season's activity, but...

- Watch out for your Christmas tree! Make sure it's anchored so that an exploring kitty won't bring it down. Make sure that there's no tinsel which can get stuck in the intestines and become a life-threatening issue. Avoid glass ornaments or edible decorations which may be irresistible.
- \* Many Christmas plants such as poinsettias and holly are toxic to dogs and cats. Make sure that they are well out of reach.
- Make sure those beautiful scented candles are out of reach of a wagging tail or kitty paw-swipe!
- Holiday dinners taste just as good to your pets as to you! But so much of it is bad for their digestive systems. Turkey bones will easily splinter and cause problems with choking or blocking. Chocolate is toxic to dogs. Dried fruits often contains grapes which can cause renal failure. And alcohol is poisonous to cats and dogs. Make sure that your food is out of reach and put away after the gorging has finished!
- Lastly, when you're taking your dog out to try to counteract the vast amount of food you've just eaten, watch the roads. Rock salt and antifreeze can cause huge issues if ingested, or if it gets into cuts and scrapes. Try to wipe down paws after a walk.

Representing a litter of Boxer/Malinois crosses is Rocky!! This litter is developing into confident, playful and adventurous pups!




## **Kittens Available for Adoption**
