Hunter's Corner



Hunter's face says everything: "I don't care how cold it is outside, I want to go for a walk and I want to go NOW!". But is exercise during cold winter days a good idea?

The short answer is yes, absolutely. Dogs need physical activity or they might become bored, stressed and overweight. As long as your dog is in relatively good shape, there's no reason to continue with an exercise regime while factoring in some changes to accommodate the weather.

Make sure that your dog is kept warm during winter walks. Although they carry built-in fur coats, they may need a doggy jacket to keep them warm, particularly if they're older dogs or smaller breeds. You might also consider some dog booties, especially if you're walking in an area where people are using salt or de-icers. Hunter absolutely will NOT wear boots, so on bad days we put petroleum jelly to protect the pads of his feet.

There may be days when walking is not

recommended, when it's just too cold to walk. If it's too cold for you, it's likely too cold for your dog. When it's too cold for Hunter, he holds a paw up and looks at me. I know then it's time to head back inside. Keep an eye on your dog and be attentive to visual cues that mean you're dog is too cold.

If it's too cold to go for a long walk, there are ways to exercise and keep your dog engaged and active inside. Depending on the size of your home, you can play fetch or tug-of-war in a hallway. You can put together puzzles for your dog to complete. Coming up with alternative exercises will ensure that your dog doesn't rip apart the garbage because he's bored!!

If you are looking for an affordable location for spaying or neutering your pet, check the spayneuterontario.com website. This is a clinic located between Belleville and Trenton, and spaying and neutering is the only service they provide. As such, their prices are more accessible for the public, and they are committed to reducing an unwanted pet population. They work as well with many rescues, including Home Again, as well as TNR and feral cat colonies.
