Hunter's Corner



Those of you who have been following Hunter's story know that it has had its ups and downs. For families who are considering bringing a rescue dog into their lives, remember that it can take considerable time for a dog or cat to become relaxed and happy.

Hunter started off his life with us in combat mode. He was fine with us, but assertive with other dogs. He was tremendously leash reactive, and distrustful of people, mainly men.

After a year with us, he was much more relaxed but still a bit wary of people he didn't really know. He loved us, loved our neighbours and their dogs, but couldn't really be trusted around anyone else. He heel -nipped, and jumped up on people.

We then found out that our poor boy was really sick. He had heartworm, relatively rare in our region (although incidents of heartworm are rising), and horrible to treat. After a summer of painful injections and a ton of medication, Hunter was pronounced

heartworm free!! Yay!!

Hunter's personality continued to evolve. He was now playing with toys, and playing with the little dogs next door and has turned into a snuggle pup. He has had sleepovers with other dogs, and plays and romps with all of them.

Hunter still experiences mannerisms that we can't explain. If only we could ask him what had happened in his former life! He will rarely turn his back to you—it's comical, but he only ever backs away rather than turning around. And although he loves being in the car, getting him into it can require a lot of cajoling and patience.

We are coming up on three years of having the good fortune to live with this dog. A month ago he developed a growth, and until we received results back thought we might be saying goodbye. Thankfully, just a benign ick that has since disappeared.

Rescue dogs can be challenging. Years after their adoption they may exhibit behaviours that will cause you to scratch your head. Have patience. They deserve their new life!

Hunter's case also highlights the need to make sure that you are giving your dog heartworm prevention. He almost assuredly had not been given prevention before he came to live with us, and the treatment is really difficult for a dog. It consists of a month of antibiotics and steroids, a nasty injection in the back by the tail, another month of steroids, two more of the horrid injections and another month of steroids. And then you wait for 8 months to make sure that the dog is free of the antigens that indicate heartworm. Lastly, your dog needs to have tremendously decreased activity levels to ensure the worms don't break off and cause a pulmonary embolism.

And at the risk of being a nag, please make sure your dog has also been given preventative medication against the bites from fleas/ticks. A tick bite can cause both an infection at the site of the bite, the transmission of a disease such as Lyme disease, and even a paralytic condition that is caused by the tick's saliva entering the bloodstream. If you see a tick on your dog or cat, remove it carefully. You may want to have your pet tested at the vet for illness, and treated is the test returns positive.

A pet is a huge commitment. But look at all the joy they bring into our lives!
