Hunter's Corner



Being new to the business of rescuing dogs, we have worried about whether Hunter is happy with us. Does he miss running with his pack? Is he getting enough stimulation? Enjoying his life again?

There are a number of signs to tell you whether your dog is happy.

Look at their body language. Are they relaxed around you, with floppy ears and a softly wagging tail? Do their eyes seem to soften when they look at you, often seeming to smile?

How are they on walks? Are they a bit playful, enjoying their time outside and generally exhibiting the training and good behaviour you've instilled in them?

What kind of sounds are coming out of them? Are they little yips and barks? Whines if they're dying to do something?

Are they sleeping well? Eating well?

Do they have periods of bouncing around, showing zoomies and greeting you and others enthusiastically?

All the above signs would suggest that your dog is happy. And all apply to Hunter, or at least most of the time. Hunter is still cautious around other, bigger dogs, particularly male dogs. And although he sleeps well, he does still have the night terrors that break my heart. But in general, we're confident that he is a happy pup! We've spent a lot of time building his confidence, and making sure he knows that he's here to stay. He still has his quirks—he needs to be invited into the car before jumping up, and he still moves things from one end of the house to the other if left alone (no chewing, no destruction, just a rearrangement of the smaller things within his grasp), but he clearly loves us and is happier.

Remember that you can influence your dog's happiness. Make sure that they are getting a balanced, healthy diet that is aligned to their stage in life and any health concerns. Sometimes walks aren't enough—make sure that your dog has enough mental stimulation. Hunter loves Waldo the Whale and Freddie the Frog, and spends some time each day squeaking and dancing with them.

Most importantly, make sure your dog, in particular your rescue dog, has lots and lots of love and affection. They often need assurance. Hunter is happiest sitting next to us, being petted with the smallest of gestures. He seeks out affection, bunting our hands with his snoot. He is always close. He is our Hunter.

Adoptable Dogs—Take Another Look!



This is **Bonnie**, a female Beagle/Husky cross who is 9 weeks old and under 10 pounds.

A Round of Applause!!!

Last month our hard-working volunteers adopted out 18 dogs and 14 cats!! That averages to over one animal a day adopted to forever families! Remember that it takes a village to adopt out a dog or cat:

- Notification of an animal in need
- Assessment intake by a volunteer
- Assessment by a veterinarian and initial vaccinations/chipping/spaying and neutering (if the animal is old enough) done
- Search for a foster family, and place with the foster family, including provision of all necessary supplies
- Updating of web sites and social media showing available animals
- Review of incoming emails and telephone calls from people expressing interest
- Analysis of family requests for an adoption
- Adoption day!

Thank you to our volunteers — fosters, community members, drivers — the list is too long to mention each of you.

And for people with cats and dogs, please remember to have your pet spayed or neutered. Home Again is frequently asked for assistance when surprise litters occur. We have a finite number of people available or willing to foster, and sometimes we are simply unable to help because we don't have the necessary people resources.

This is **Peaches**, a short haired female calico. Peaches would prefer to be adopted somewhere without small children so that she can cozy up to her new adult owner!






Seaweed is a male brown short haired tabby. He is super social and lovable, and will even snuggle under the covers at night! He also loves to snuggle with his brother **Captain**.
